Uniform

P.E./Swimming

Home Learning

- Home learning will be given out on a Thursday. Please return the book bags the following Tuesday.
- Daily reading at home (10 minutes every day).
- Books will be changed once a week
- Tricky and decodable words (5 minutes every day).
- Weekly handwriting.
- Show and Tell (2 minute presentation)

Reading records

Your child is expected to read at home (with an adult), every day for at least 10 minutes.

Please fill in their reading record with a comment about how they have read, and/or any comments or questions they had about the books. Please let us know if they have moved on to the next phase of tricky and decodable words.

Reading records will be checked.

Reading record comment examples

What went well

- Excellent sounding out
- Confidence
- Reading with greater fluency
- Recognising high frequency words
- Learning the meaning of a new word
- Persistence with reading
- Excellent understanding / ability retelling the story
- Comments made about characters and events








General Reminders
