New for 2023/24 School lunches

We fund free school lunches for every child in our nursery class.

The local authority funds school lunches for every child who is entitled to Free School meals.

The London Mayor is funding every other pupil for one academic year.

We really encourage everyone to eat at school.





School gates open at **8.35-8.45am** and children arriving after 8.50 will be marked as 'late' as **learning begins straight away.** Please ensure your children are on time for school.

Children complete their early-morning learning at the start of the day. If they are late and miss it, they will have to stay in and complete it during first or lunch play.

All children must have a reusable, named water bottle. Children should take their lunch boxes into their classrooms.

<u>Play times</u>

- Early break 15 minutes
- Mini break 10 minutes
- Lunch play 50 minutes
- End of day- 3.30 (2.15pm on Fridays)





- Bring reusable water bottle and reading book every day
- Home Learning daily reading / daily maths / SumDog / weekly spelling.
- Children come to school wearing PE kit on Monday.
- Swimming on Tuesday children come to school in uniform. Information is in the letter.

Before and after the school day



- Children can arrive for breakfast club at **7.50am**
- Please sign up for after school clubs via the office or school gateway
- Liaise with the office <u>and</u> class teacher if there is a change in adult collecting your child





Please send your child to school with a small, <u>healthy</u> snack for first break.

No nuts or nut products please.



Reusable water bottles are to be brought into the classroom every day (labelled please). Single use water bottles will be recycled and not reused so please invest in a reusable bottle.

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





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Knowledge Organiser: Magnetism as a force (Year 3)

Key vocabulary

Force: In physics, force is a push or pull on an object. A force can cause an object to move, speed up, slow down, stay in the same place, or change shape.

Friction: Friction is a force. Anytime two objects rub against each other, they cause friction. Friction works to slow movement.

Material: The matter from which something is made.

Magnet A magnet attracts some metals using a force.

Attract To pull towards.

Repel To push back.

Magnetic material: a material that is attracted to (pulled towards) a magnet


Magnetism: magnetism is an invisible force that attracts a magnetic materials towards a magnet.










Behaviour policy: Our Rules and Values



All children are expected to show our values









We expect the highest standards of behavior at Avonmore to enable all children to feel safe and reach their potential.

At Avonmore, our behaviour policy has **been informed by much research** that supports the idea that children respond better to an approach focused on self-reflection and relationships.

We support children when they do not meet our behaviour expectations by scaffolding some reflection time in which an adult will ask them to think about who their actions are having a negative impact on and how they can make the situation better. We also prompt children to think about what they could do differently next time and reinforce a culture that 'mistakes are OK, as long as we learn from them'.





We will communicate with parents and carers at the end of the school day if their child has had a difficult day with their behavior.

We use lots of reward systems such as star of the week, special mentions in assembly and house points.




