

# **Seception baseline assessment**

The reception baseline assessment (RBA) is a short, task-based assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school. It became statutory for all schools from September 2021.

The assessment will take place during your child's first 6 weeks at school. It will be a short one-to-one session with their teacher or teaching assistant, where your child will do a number of practical and interactive tasks.

Children will not 'pass' or 'fail' the assessment; it will provide a snapshot of where they are when they start school in the Reception year. The data from the assessment will only be used at school level to measure the progress of the year group from Reception to Year 6. The data from the assessment, including numerical scores, will not be shared with parents, pupils, teachers, or external bodies, including schools. There will be no published score.





Avonmore Primary School

- At Avonmore we use an online learning tool called Tapestry. This is where the school uploads photos and videos of all of the wonderful learning your child has been doing.
- Each parent will need to sign up to Tapestry.
- On Tapestry you will see your child's individual learning once every term and a weekly newsletter on a Friday. Miss Bagge will also occasionally send out reminders on Tapestry.
- This is a great opportunity for you to see what learning your child has been doing in school.
- It also allows parents to add photographs so that the school can see what the child has been doing at home. We strongly encourage all parents to do this regularly.

# Starting Reception in September

- A gradual transition is crucial to the well-being of children entering school for the first time.
- Each individual child's start to school will be staggered You should have received an email letting you know your child's start date.
- Some children will continue on half days initially but we will discuss this with you in the first two weeks if that is the case.
- •We will work closely in partnership with families to ensure the settling in process is smooth.



- •1:1 Parent meetings for all parents to take place at school: Tuesday 3rd and Wednesday 4th September.
  - These meetings will take place in school in the Reception classroom.
  - The meetings will last for 10 minutes.
  - The dates and times will be emailed to you.

#### Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> September – First half of the class 8.35am – 12.15pm Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September – Second half of the class 8.35am – 12.15pm

If your child attends on Thursday they will not attend on Friday and then the same if your child is attending on Friday they will not attend on Thursday. Your child will eat lunch at school on this day.

Monday 9<sup>th</sup> – Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> September – All children 8.35am – 12.30pm Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> September onwards – All children 8.35am – 3.30pm Except for Friday 8.35am – 2.15pm (depending on how each individual child is settling)

Please ensure you are on time for school, as arriving late affects the whole class and your child's learning. If your child arrives late they will need to enter through the school office.

#### <u>The full school day finishes at 3:30pm Monday – Thursday and at 2:15pm on</u> <u>Fridays. We open the gates at 3.20pm Mon – Thurs and 2.10pm on a Friday.</u>

It is essential that you arrive on time to pick up your child. After 3:35pm children will be taken to the school office.

Please ensure that an adult from the class has been told if someone other than their normal adult is collecting or picking up your child. Please also let the office know.

#### **Appointments**

Letter/email sent to the office. Where possible please arrange these outside of school hours.

#### Absences

Please report to the office (phone/letter) asap. Please do not take holiday during term time. Absences will be recorded on your child's school report.





Keep your child at home if:

- They are vomiting or have diarrhoea or have had these symptoms in the past 24 hours
- They are diagnosed with an infectious virus such as chickenpox, measles, mumps or impetigo
- They have a high fever
- Coughs and colds are very common in the winter months please only keep your child at home if they are not themselves, are feverish or exceptionally tired
- Please inform the office of any contagious illnesses

On PE days your child comes to school wearing their PE kits. Please make sure that all of your child's clothing is clearly labelled.





- Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately we go outside in all weathers. This must include a coat with a hood.
- Please provide a named pair of wellington boots that can stay in school.
- On cold days please ensure your child has a hat, scarf and gloves.
- Please provide a coat with easy fastening we encourage the children to be independent.
- On hot days please provide a sun hat and ensure that you apply sun cream.
- Please provide a spare change of clothes in a bag that will be kept on their peg underwear, socks/tights, t-shirt, jumper and trousers. If your child does get wet or have an accident and they **do not** have a spare set of clothes in school we will have to call you to ask you to come and change them.
- PLEASE LABEL EVERYTHING





- The children do get to explore lots of different things and this includes a lot of messy play.
- The children are encouraged to put on an apron but, as you can imagine their clothes might get messy and dirty at times.
- It is advisable that you have a spare set of school uniform at home.









- Each week from Autumn 2 the children will attend Forest School for one afternoon (Marcus Garvey Park forest area)
- It offers children the opportunity to develop and grow through hands-on learning experiences in a woodland or natural environment with trees.
- The children will need to come to school in their PE kit on Forest School days and wear appropriate layers
- The children will need a named pair of wellington boots that they can leave in school.
- •We go to Forest School in all weather.












- Please no cakes or party bags. You may bring in some fruit, a book for the class to share or donate something from our Amazon wishlist.

Behaviour policy: Our Rules and Values



All children are expected to show our values









We expect the highest standards of behavior at Avonmore to enable all children to feel safe and reach their potential.

At Avonmore, our behaviour policy has **been informed by much research** that supports the idea that children respond better to an approach focused on self-reflection and relationships.

We support children when they do not meet our behaviour expectations by scaffolding some reflection time in which an adult will ask them to think about who their actions are having a negative impact on and how they can make the situation better. We also prompt children to think about what they could do differently next time and reinforce a culture that 'mistakes are OK, as long as we learn from them'.





We will communicate with parents and carers at the end of the school day if their child has had a difficult day with their behavior.

We use lots of reward systems such as star of the week, special mentions in assembly and house points.

## In preparation for school



Children should be able to:

- Go to the toilet on their own (including wiping)
- Blow their own nose
- Wash and dry their hands independently
- Put on and take off their own coat and shoes
- Be able to mostly dress and undress themselves
- School lunches beginning to eat with a knife and fork independently

If your child finds any of these things difficult please practise over the holidays.



## In preparation for school



Please prepare your child for Reception by:

- Having a fun, active holiday, playing outside as much as possible. Build up your child's physical strength
- Daily storytime we cannot stress the importance of reading everyday with your child
- Make sure you have a good sleep routine in place at least two weeks before the start of the term
- Helping them to learn the names of staff and encouraging them to greet them when meeting them
- Please try to have lots of discussion about how exciting it will be to start Reception. New friends, new activities and new learning!

### In preparation for Reception– All About Me Box

Over the summer holidays please create a box containing objects, pictures and favourite things of your child's. It would also be great to have something about their culture as well.

We use this as a transitional object at the beginning of the term in the first few weeks. The children get to stand up and present their boxes and talk all about themselves. It is also a great opportunity for the staff to get to know the children a little better.

We will look after the boxes very carefully and return them as soon as your child has had a turn at showing them to their
